His second major role, celebrated here, made him an icon as he played the brooding Jim Stark in Nicholas Ray's 1955 film, Rebel Without a Cause. A western flick - called Giant - followed in 1956. Filming had not long finished when he set out in his Porsche Spyder and into timeless cult legend...

And yes, the poster for the film Rebel Without a Cause colourised this photo with a BLUE jacket, but in real life it was indeed red, as shown here!

Darth Vader



If one villain caught cinema-goers imagination throughout the late seventies it was Darth Vader.

Alongside the shark from Jaws, the Daleks on TV and a few other honoured baddies, Vader represents that classic evil that we love to hate from the era many of us grew up in.

This quality cardboard cut out depicts Luke's father — sorry if you haven't watched that far yet — holding his lightsaber, ready to take on the rebellious scum...

Storm Trooper



The military soldiers unwaveringly loyal to the Emperor, stormtroopers represented the most visible extension of Imperial might.

Storm troopers intended to strike with speed and accuracy, putting down insurrections and maintaining order on the far-flung worlds of the Empire.

Yet another iconic image from Star Wars is fully realised as a life size cardboard cut out.

Ideal on his own or accompanying Darth Vader, this stormtrooper has blaster poised ready for firing.

Princess Leia

Oliver Hardy



Oliver Hardy, one half of one of the most famous comedy teams in history, in classic pose and costume.

Norvell Hardy was born on Jan 18th 1892 in Harlem Georgia — he later called himself Oliver in honour of his father, who died when he was only young. At eighteen he ran a cinema, saw the films and thought he could do better. Simple, eh?

After a long career — most footage of which is lost — he teamed up with Cumbrian born Stan Laurel after a director noticed how well they worked together.

Stan Laurel



Born to a family of British stage performers, in Ulverston, Cumbria, England, Stan Laurel started acting at an early age and first toured America as understudy to a fellow called Charlie Chaplin.

He remained in the States to perform in vaudeville and, in 1917, supplemented his stage work by appearing as clownish misfit types in comedy shorts often spoofing dramatic films of the period.

One of these was a two-reeler called Lucky Dog (1918), in which he appeared totally by accident with Oliver Hardy.

The two would not appear together again until 1926.

The Three Stooges



This line up of the Three Stooges shows Joe DeRita, Moe Howard and Larry Fine in top hat and tails mood as the famous trio of slapstick bunglers.

The Three Stooges are a classic of American comedy, even though the line-up changed — did you know that Moe and Larry were there for the Stooges' entire film career, but the position of the third Stooge was filled by several people?

After Curly left the act, Shemp played the part, and after Shemp, there was Joe, and finally Curly Joe. Moe, Shemp, and Curly were brothers of a family of five brothers. Neither of the other two brothers got into show business!

Humphrey Bogart



The ultimate on-screen tough guy, in a cool pose — everything a movie star should be. He may not be the prettiest man alive, but you can't beat a bit of Bogart. . .

Humphrey Bogart has probably been imitated more than any other actor. His film characters such as Sam Spade, Rick Blaine, Duke Mantee and Fred C. Dobbs, to name a few, have become woven into the fabric of culture.

Bogart's screen persona -the tight-lipped, streetwise thug -is a testament to his gifts as an actor, especially when contrasted against his upper crust upbringing. Bogey's unique voice comes partly from a wound (some say a war wound, others say it's one he sustained as a child) which causes his trademark lisp. . .
